STATEMENT

To the Commissioner of Patents:

National Battery Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the State of Delaware, and located at St. Paul, Ramsey County, Minnesota, and doing business at 1704 Roblyn Avenue, St. Paul, Minnesota, has adopted and used the trade-mark shown in the accompanying drawing, for ELECTRIC BATTERIES, in Class 21, Electrical apparatus, machines, and supplies, and presents herewith five facsimiles showing the trade-mark as actually used by applicant upon the goods, and requests that the same be registered in the United States Patent Office in accordance with the act of February 20, 1905.
